MORE VIGILANCE AROUND ST ANTHONY'S SCHOOL AND CHURCH

A number of weeks ago, we received some reports concerning some teenagers, already known to the police, who usually gathered around St Anthony's School and our Church property after hours. They were not known to have caused any damage within our vicinity. It could have been a case of kids being kids but we did not take any chances. Good enough, they are rarely sighted around our properties today.

Currently, we have also been receiving a number of reports from parishioners and parents from St Anthony's School and Kindergarten concerning an apparently homeless person who is often sighted around the area. We appreciate this concern. We have consequently investigated the matter and have taken action. Please be informed that the school has contacted the civil authorities that need to know about this situation. We have also contacted the lady. She understands very well that she is not allowed around the school and the kindergarten and she seems to be respecting it. We have also notified her about some local charities that might be of help to her. We have informed the charities as well. It is entirely up to her to whether or not to take up the offer. In this day and age, even a person with the best intentions can only offer limited levels of persuasion. After all, anyone, including homeless people, who are not yet criminally indicted has the right to walk along any street.

Finally, we should bear in mind that as Catholics, we should always be guarded by the principles of Catholic Social Teachings in our interactions with people who are seemingly disadvantaged. Homeless people and street kids most times require our compassion and respect rather than fear and suspicion. They could be reminding us of our privileged position in the society. They could be inviting us to take actions of Christian charity.


