OTHER ROLES PLAYED BY PRIESTS

Apart from attending to spiritual needs, are there other things priests do for their parishioners?

Many Catholics already know and explore the benefits of having priests around them but some Catholics do not. They seem to be reluctant to make demands on their priests. Possibly, they do not intend to add to the workload of their already "busy" priest. Whatever the case, we should always remember that the core value of priestly celibacy is that it allows priests to devote their full attention to God and his People; particularly, their parishioners. Most priests are quite willing to be "troubled" by needy Parishioners. So, below are some of the "other" things priests could do, which Fr. Emmanuel does not mind doing.

Firstly, writing recommendation letters and standing as a referee, even on legal issues, for his parishioners. This seems quite common as a lot of our parishioners have asked for it without disappointment. However, it is good for parishioners asking for such to ensure that they are already known to their priest. This could be as simple as introducing yourself to him or by participating more actively in parish ministries and activities.

Secondly, priests also support their parishioners and their families when they face some life challenges and difficult times. No topic or issue is off limit for priests. They may not have all the answers all the time but by their training, they are often well equipped to offer necessary assistance. Feel free to invite Fr Emmanuel during your difficult moments as well as to your parties and fun moments.

Thirdly, priests also offer free counselling on various issues, especially those bordering on spiritual, moral, social and day-to-day concerns. All you need to do is to book an appointment and be open-minded on such issues.

Also, priests are community leaders and can also get involved in community activities, especially the ones that they have personal interests in or the ones that are of compelling need to the broader community. However, he treads carefully on divisive issues – always standing on the side of truth and common good. He also ensures that his community involvement does not overshadow his main calling.

Finally, visiting their parishioners especially at their homes, in hospitals or any other place is also part of a priest's role. He can even visit just to keep company or dine with a family.
