Exaggerated sense of privacy and personal pride fuelled by our modern culture is definitely not of any assistance in this matter. They easily make us afraid of "exposing" our vulnerability to others. No matter the challenge or burden that we bear, help is often easily available.

We therefore encourage our parishioners not to shy away from sharing their "simple" burdens with the people that they trust even within our parish community. One can also seek professional help on his or her troubling issues, when necessary. Also, bear in mind that Fr Emmanuel is always available to render support, consultation, guidance and prayer whenever you need a priest. Never be shy to ask him for some pastoral, spiritual and moral support when you are in need.

#### UPDATE.....

To keep you updated on our work in the Alexandra Hills and Capalaba area: In the last two months we had 41 calls, helping approximately 120 people. People are mainly struggling when they have to pay for an unexpected expense eg.: car repairs, a school excursion, etc. We also realised that renters also have to pay the water bills, which was quietly introduced. So they are not only paying high rent, but also now pay for the water bill. We financed a drivers license (for a client to start work), a uniform for a student who had outgrown the old. Our food bank visits are very rewarding. Though it is hit and miss, we always manage to get good fresh vegies for our clients who are really happy to receive them.
