Scripture Reflection

"Christ: Priest and suffering servant"

'This week, through service of others, let us express our gratitude for what Christ has won for us.'



This Sunday, following the predictions Jesus gave of his suffering and death, we contemplate our Saviour and the implications for us, his followers.

The **First Reading** comes from part of Isaiah's last song of the suffering servant. It fore-tells Jesus taking on our faults, and speaks not only of his Passion, but also his glory.

The **Psalm** sings of God's love as he rescues those who hope in him. The writer of the letter to the Hebrews presents Jesus as human and weak like us, but also as the supreme high priest. We can be confident that he will always help us. (**Second Reading**)

In the **Gospel**, James and John hope for privileged places in the kingdom, but learn that they, like Jesus, must go through suffering and death. They are asked to serve, not to dominate.

Perhaps this week we can deepen our understanding of what Christ has won for us, and express our gratitude through service of others.

Bethany Ministry

Parish Support in times of Grief

The title Bethany seems most appropriate for this ministry. It was in Bethany that Jesus was anointed in preparation for His own death. It was there, too, that Jesus came to console and support Martha and Mary, at the death of Lazarus.

Our Bethany Mass

As is the tradition in other parishes, a special Mass is celebrated on the first Saturday morning in November for the deceased, whose names are recorded and read at the Mass.

This celebration of new life has become very significant to the bereaved families in other churches. Those who have lost a family member during each year, are invited, to be present and a general invitation, through the parish newsletter, is extended to all who wish to attend.

In our circumstances, since this is our inaugural Bethany Mass, and nearly two years since Covid 19 took hold in Australia, we are inviting anyone who has lost a loved one in recent times during COVID and just prior to that, to come and celebrate, in community, the new life of their loved one.

Usually, candles are lit, and flowers are placed as symbols of love and remembrance for those who have died.

CICCA [Christian Initiation of Children of Catechetical Age.]



Otherwise known as the Sacramental Program.

The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist.

- 1. You may register your child at any time from June onwards, each year, for the following year.
- **2. Each child** receives a Mass Card to be signed by the priest when you are able to take your child to any of our 4 Masses. [4.30 pm Sat & 9.00 am Sunday at St Anthony's and 6.00 pm Sat & 7.00 am Sun at St Luke's]. We recommend, to begin with, you attend every couple of weeks to fit in with your family activities. A child's comfort and participation in Mass regularly will help us discern his/her readiness to receive the Sacraments in the following year.
- **3.** In October each year, we will have information sessions for you, the parents. It is essential for you to attend one of these sessions in order for you to have enough information to plan ahead for the next year. [See Dates below]
- **4. At the** beginning of each year, we discern with you and your child his/her readiness to be enrolled in the *formation program for Baptism, Confirmation or First Communion*.
- **5. Once Enrolled your child** must then attend the relative sessions/workshops as planned for your child to celebrate the Sacraments in the first half of the year.

Baptism for Older Children

Parents of children of Primary school age and older are welcome to register for Baptism. *Information for these parents occur in the third term of school each year.* Inquiries are welcome at any time.

Confirmation

The Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion complete the full initiation Journey.

Information Sessions for Parents occur in October the year before the journey begins

The Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion complete the full initiation Journey.


