Scripture Reflection

'Blessed is the fruit of your womb!'

We journey through these last days of Advent in Mary's company.



Christ is coming! The readings this weekend are full of an expectation. God's promise through

Micah is fulfilled in the encounter between Mary and Elizabeth, and their faith.

In the **First Reading**, Micah proclaims that the Messiah will come from Bethlehem and lead his flock back to their land in peace. The **Psalm** is a plea to the Shepherd of Israel for this return, and for the sending of the Messiah, the chosen one.

The **Second Reading** from the Letter to the Hebrews emphasises the fact that the Christ who redeemed us took on a human body, like ours. The **Gospel** helps us gather all these themes: obedience to God's will; faith in his promises; and especially faith in the Incarnation – Jesus our Saviour, already becoming flesh in Mary's womb.

May we journey through these last days of Advent in Mary's company, so that Christ may be born in us.

Farewell from Dave Nightingale

It's hard to believe that it's almost 11 months ago that I arrived in the parish, Saturday 23rd January. I arrived that morning, brought my bags to the presbytery, settled in, and then attended all the weekend Masses. I'm pretty sure I would have spoken at those Masses, and while I may have seemed calm, I certainly had questions running through my head. What would my pastoral placement be like? What would the parishioners be like? How would I fit in? What things would I be doing? How would the year go?

Well, now that I've reached the end of the placement, I can very much say that I am so glad I came to St Anthony and St Luke's Parish! From the very beginning I was welcomed by so many of you and made to feel like I belonged. I enjoyed speaking with so many of you and appreciated the greetings and smiles on the way in and out of Mass. I would like to thank you all for making me feel welcome and I'd especially like to thank those people who looked out for me, showed their care, asked how I was going, invited me for dinners and coffees, gave me plants or jams or doggy bags to take home. I felt very much loved.

From the beginning, I was impressed with just how much is done behind the scenes by people who don't ask for any credit but simply want to serve God and serve the church through offering their gifts and talents. From the beginning, I've seen firsthand and want to appreciate the efforts people went to in the parish working bees, the wonderful work of the ladies group, the faithful devotion of the rosary group, the two hearts prayer group, the Christian meditation groups, the Scriptural Meditation group, the tireless service of the St Vincent de Paul society, Padua Place committee, the volunteers who take communion to and who visit the sick, the volunteers who clean the church, who mow and look after the gardens, who decorate the church, who look after the technology and sound side of things, the sacristans who prepare for each mass, the liturgy team who prepare the liturgies, the music ministry who practice so much to enrich the liturgy, the pastoral council who seek to guide the parish, the finance council who helped Fr Emmanuel so much, the people who prepare others for baptism, for RCIA, for those volunteers who helped with the sacramental program and similarly those parents who volunteered to help with children's liturgy. To the priests who have been so accommodating in filling in so that we can have Mass.

Special thanks must also go to all those who have helped out in establishing our parish youth group. I still remember meeting with you earlier in the year and how we kind of stepped out in faith to try and provide something for the wonderful youth of the parish. I remember us asking the question, "Do you think there will be much interest in it?" Thank goodness we went forward in faith. I want to thank you for the work that you have put into the youth group, whether it's in preparing food, promoting, planning games and activities, safeguarding, risk assessments etc. I feel confident that things will keep moving into next year.

Thanks also to the school staff and especially the APRE's, Kellie and Peta, who were so supportive of me this year, and who were so accommodating of the projects I wanted to try. It was a pleasure working with you.

To the children and youth of the parish, I want to thank you for the witness you've been to me. Each time I've been with you in children's liturgy, class visits, lunchtime youth groups, parish youth group, sacramental program sessions, I've been impressed with your insights and wisdom, your enthusiasm, your energy, and your openness to God. If I can leave you with anything, I just want to say that no matter what happens in life, always trust in Jesus. He will never leave you or forsake you. He loves and cares for you more than you can imagine. And talk to Him and share everything with Him, your joys and hopes, but also the things that make you worried or sad. And trust Him to look after you.

Finally, thanks to those I've been blessed to work with closely most days this year. To Maria, our wonderful parish secretary, who is so organized, so diligent, so selfless, so caring, and who has made my placement so much easier this year. Thank you for being so supportive. And to Trish, our wonderful pastoral associate who is employed for 15 hours per week but I can testify that she spends a lot more than that with the sacramental program and with pastoral concerns. Thank you also for your commitment to the parish and for the care that you showed me throughout the year. To Fr Emmanuel, thank you for having me in the parish. I certainly learnt a lot this year and gained so many skills and had some wonderful experiences. Thank you for asking for a seminarian for this parish for 2021, because that was what led me to be here to meet so many wonderful people.

I will always pray for this parish and especially that God will continue to reveal to each one of you His immense love and care. God bless you, and hopefully I'll meet you again soon.




