BISHOPS from India, Europe and the United States, as well as 20 members of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, were among those who attended the ordination and installation ceremony of Bishop John Panamthottathil on 31 May 2023.

He was ordained by Cardinal George Alencherry, the Major Archbishop of the Syro-Malabar Church. Bishop Bosco Puthur, the first Syro-Malabar Bishop in Australia, and Bishop Remigius Inchananiyil of Thamarasserry, India, were the co-consecrators.

The Most Holy TRINITY

Dear Parishioners and visitors,

God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, the church celebrates the feast of the Holy Trinity. Our prayers begin and end with the invocation 'in the name of the father and the son and the holy spirit', as we make the sign of the Cross.

The sacraments are celebrated in the name of Trinity. At the beginning of Holy Mass, we listen to the Pauline greeting "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all"

Three persons in one God? What is the nature of God? How can we explain God? Centuries ago, as God gave a new mission to Moses to lead Israel to freedom, Moses asked God "who are you"? How can I explain you and your name to the people? God said to Moses I AM WHO I AM (Exodus 3:14). God is the one who always Is.

God created us in God's own image and likeness (Genesis 1:27). The Catholic Church teaches, and we profess in the creed, "I believe in God the Father, I believe in Jesus Christ his son, I believe in the Holy Spirit". God is the communion of these three persons.

There are 73 books in the Bible, and the Old Testament or the first 46 books present God as a loving, guiding and protecting father. The Gospels, the first four books of the New Testament, present Jesus as the living presence of God among us. The rest of the 23 books of the New Testament reassures the active presence of God, continuing the effect of salvation through the works of the Holy spirit.

God's nature is love. We pray, daily, calling him our father in heaven. Our God loves us as the parents love their children, unconditionally. God loves us for whom we are, we are sons and daughters of God.

The Father, sent us the son who saved us. Jesus became one of us, while remaining One with the Father. The loving son came to the world to unite us again to God, through his blood and death on the cross.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit, took place on Pentecost. We have the Presence and Power of God within us and we can make God Present to others. We can make a huge difference in our lives and in the world.

God does not exist in isolated individualism but in a community of relationships. They are not three gods, but only One God; they are of one nature and indivisible. We too cannot live as islands, we are given the ability to commit ourselves in the everyday events in order to be the leaven of communion, consolation, and mercy.

We as a loving parish community share the nature of God. We are the people, who are loved, forgiven and empowered. Let us find our meaning in life in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.




